1. Read all warnings.

- 2. Follow all instructions to ensure longevity of monitor.
- 3. Do not place the monitor near water.
- 4. Clean only with dry cloth.
- 5. Do not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- 6. Do not install near any heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other heat generating devices.
- 7. Do not override the safety purpose of the polarized or grounding-type plug.
- 8. A polarized plug has two blades with one wider than the other.

If your video wall system requires an unified control by the central control (do not use provided video wall screen control software), please use the provided RJ-45(RS-232) cables to configure the system. If necessary, you can make your own RJ-45(RS-232) cables based on the above pin map. If you have further questions, please contact ViewZ.

Firmware Upgrade/Update Process

- 1. Download or copy Firmware file from ViewZ.
- 2. Copy the file to the empty USB
 - *Caution This file should be placed in the root folder of USB.
- 3. The software name is fixed as FLW V56, BIN file type.
 - Please note that the firmware file name should not be modified, otherwise the board cannot identify the firmware file.
- 4. Turn off the monitor and insert the USB drive to the USB interface of monitor.
- 5. Turn the power back on, then the monitor will be automatically upgraded/updated.
 - During the upgrade/update process, the power indicator will be flashing.
 - When the upgrade/update is completedm the power indicator will stop flashing.
